- 1. Market craftspeople sell <u>HANDMADE</u> items on the Market's daystalls.
- 2. A <u>DAYSTALL</u> is rented by the day by different farmers or craftspeople who have permits to sell their handmade or homegrown products in the Market.
- 3. The Pike Place Market is a <u>HISTORICAL DISTRICT</u> that is preserved for its traditional uses as well as its old buildings and streets.
- 4. A <u>HIGHSTALL</u> is permanently rented all year by vendors who sell vegetables and fruits from around the world.
- 5. "MEET THE PRODUCER" is a traditional theme of the Pike Place Market.
- 6. About 500 people live in the Market. Many have low incomes and are over 65. The <u>MARKET FOUNDATION</u> raises money to help these people get food, medical care, and more. <u>RACHEL</u> collects about \$10,000 all by herself for these helping services.
- 7. A street performer who gets tips is also called a BUSKER.
- 8. "Mom-and-pop" shops are family-owned businesses that are <u>OWNER-OPERATED</u>.
- 9. A shopper is a type of <u>CONSUMER</u>.
